Santa will be making a special appearance in the Community Theater (1^{st} floor) from 4pm - 7:30pm. In addition to visiting with Santa, guests are invited to enjoy a variety of activities including Ask a Doc with Kaiser

Permanente physicians, book giveaway, multi-cultural creativity zone, and fun games with jolly elves.



Upstairs, in the Iron Triangle Theater, East Bay Center resident companies will present *A Richmond Nutcracker*, a spectacular multi-discipline performance. Classic characters, stories, and dances will be presented in both traditional and distinctly Richmond interpretations. Performances are scheduled for 5pm and 6:30pm (running time approximately 45 minutes).

Following the second performance, a procession will lead guests outdoors for group caroling and the ceremonial illumination of the holiday street lights.
