

Downtown Richmond Banner Project

RMSI partnered with two artists, Tiffany Conway, and Malcolm Jackson, on a public art project that created new light pole banners for the City's historic Downtown corridor and an accompanying mini-documentary video. Tiffany Conway, a Richmond-based painter, utilized her unique aesthetic vocabulary and approach to portraiture banner artwork featuring four (4) Downtown Richmond business owners and conveyed messages of resilience, hope, and positivity through emotive storytelling. In appreciation for their time and participation, each business owner will receive the original painting of their portrait. Malcolm Jackson, a local photographer/videographer with deep ties to Richmond, created a short video that documented the project.




